High selling Open heifer this year was "0184's" April '23 Basin Jameson 1076 daughter who sold for \$21,000.00 finding a new home with Kern Cattle Company, Visalia, CA. She was followed by her Connealy Clarity January '23 sister, selling for \$18,000.00 to CS Angus, Plaunchville, LA for \$18,000.00.

High seller among the Bred heifers was Lot # 13A, A H Calvary of 5306 4303, a March '23 WAR Cavalry B063 Z044 daughter from an Express Ranch bred PVF Insight 0129 daughter. Due in October to GB Fireball 672, "4303" sold for \$15,000.00 to Wilks Ranch, Eastland, TX.

Lot # 3 Ingram Lady 453-9682, a three year old Hoover No Doubt daughter with a \$C value of +376 commanded the high price of the day bringing \$35,000.00, finding a new home at Smith Valley Angus, Salem, MO. Selling due January '24 to B I G Rig with a heifer calf, her Heifer Pregnancy lot # 3A sired by B I G Fleetwood brought an additional \$12,000.00.

The top Spring pair was lot # 2 and 2A from the sale hosts. Trowbridge Elba 130 is a first calf G A R Home Town daughter also from "564". She and her June '23 Ellingson Chaps 4095 heifer sold to Bruce Bess, NY for \$8000.00.

I was able to learn so much from her and she put her all into that week. While at the end of the week she may have not received her spot, I do know that she gained six new friends and that she had so many great things up her sleeve. Additionally, I firmly believe that she was a great one for the juniors of New York and I know she would have been a great one for the National Junior Angus Association Board of Directors. 2019 brought us to Louisville, Kentucky. In that year we had a large representation of both cattle and juniors that attended. I as well as many other royalties attended the Queens Luncheon, served as a voting delegate, participated in a variety of contests and events such as the mentor mixer, and of course showed my cattle.

2020, what a year it was on so many levels! This year made us do some quick change of plans and ended up traveling to Tulsa, Oklahoma. This was quite the hike and change to be made. My mom and I along with Megan Andersen, loaded up three head of cattle and made the long drive to Tulsa, OK. This week came with a lot of changes as one could imagine, and this Junior National was not like the rest. It brought so much joy to many families to see that the NJAA was still putting this event on

regardless of what was happening around us, and for that, I am blessed. That year I concentrated on showing my cattle and being a voting delegate and state royalty. This was a year for me to remember because of the quick changes but also because my bull got Reserve Division, which is pretty cool!

2021 brought us to Grand Island, Nebraska. This was both a rewarding and heartbreaking week for me. This was the year that I decided to run for a spot on the National Junior Angus Board of Directors. While I may have not got a spot on the board, I am thankful and blessed for everyone that helped me along that week. I am thankful for my parents and family for supporting me, watching my cattle all week, making sure I was where I needed to be, and keeping me hydrated and fed for the week. Thank you to my state junior association for being there that week, supporting me, and rooting for me. Lastly thank you to the New York State Angus Association for your support that year, and each year prior, and the impact you have on the junior association is greatly appreciated.

In 2022 the National Junior Angus Show was in Kansas City, Kansas. We had many juniors attend again, with cattle. During that year I participated in a contests, showed my cattle and did showmanship. Showmanship is a contest you get to do once in your whole junior career. While I may not have won, it was such a great experience and one that I will never forget.

Lastly, we are to my very last and final Angus Junior Nationals. 2023 brought us back to Grand Island, Nebraska. I went into this week wanting to give it my all. All year leading up to this event I was so excited to see old friends, show my cattle and walk into that showring for the very last time. At the end of the week, my heart was full, memories were had, and family time was well spent.

I am so blessed for the National Junior Angus Association and everything that they had to offer me. I am thankful for my family for allowing me to show at Junior Nationals all

ANGUS JUNIOR NATIONALS

PARENTS PERSPECTIVE

In this issue of the Angus Angles you will find an article from my daughter Anna regarding her time involved with the National Jr. Angus Association (NJAA). This is our perspective, and gratitude as parents of the opportunity and enlightenment participating in this organization has provided.

It all started on a front porch in Athens NY when a distant family member discussed with Anna showing in the National Jr. Hereford show. This was likely in the fall of 2013 if my memory is correct. She was interested, however we then found out that the National Jr. Angus show was going to be in Indianapolis Indiana that year, and neighbors of ours were going, and would provide a ride for her heifer. Angus it was and she never looked back. We pursued purchasing a heifer for her that we hoped would be competitive. I believe in the Spring of 2014 we made our first trek to Western NY to the Spring Show of the NY Jr. Beef Producers. The roughly five-hour ride was quite daunting at the time. In July of that year we loaded our heifer on a trailer which Scott Kelley drove with his son Matt's heifer to Indianapolis. This was done very very early in the morning. Twelve hours later we arrived in Indianapolis. This was an eye opener for everyone in our family. At one point, I was sure it was Anna's last show at this level, but that turned out to be quite an inaccurate thought. The heifer misbehaved badly in the ring, but she did make it through. What should be noted is that the judge that talked to Anna in the ring with Anna in tears, was very kind and understanding. The Green Coats assisting in the ring were very helpful. The next May Anna showed that same heifer in a show in Springfield Massachusetts. The judge at that show was the same judge from Jr. Nationals the summer before, and showing the same heifer won her

showmanship class. To top it off, the judge commented to her that she was having a much better day than last time they met. That was the beginning of years of many years of events as Anna described in her article.

From our perspective, it was also a time of learning, and enlightenment. So many people and organizations assisted along the way. Anna has made contacts across the Country. When we were at the American Angus Association Annual meeting one year, we were talking to a company. The person we were talking to asked about Anna. Later Anna went over to talk to them and was offered an internship on the spot by the CEO. While that internship did not occur, the connection is one that is never broken. We also made contacts throughout the Country. We got to know several people in the American Angus Association, as well as many Angus farmers and enthusiasts across this great nation. As I roamed around the Jr. Show this year in Nebraska, I was slightly saddened with talking to people, some of whom I may never see again, but who I will never forget. As parents, this was our last year. We may go back to visit, but I don't know if it will be the same.

This endeavor did not come without a significant cost. With fuel, hotel, food, entries, and livestock feed it could be several thousand dollars to go to one of the National shows depending on location, number of animals, and ability to share travel expenses with others. This does not even compare to the money and work required to prepare to compete with the best show cattle in the country. It is fair to say participating at this level caused a definite financial challenge to us. I will say, the benefits of doing this in our view was well worth it. If Anna had lost interest at any time, we would not have continued. She maintained her interest right through, so we worked very hard to support her.

I would encourage any parents to do this, but only if their children have the interest. There are many things to do in life, and if Angus Cattle are a significant part of it, then I would encourage membership and participation in the National Jr. Angus Association. If, however the Angus Cattle are not part of their interest, then I would suggest finding something different.

There are many people and organizations who assisted in different ways along the way. Many of them members of our organization, but others from around the Country. It is often a risk to start naming people who assisted, in fear we miss someone important. I however believe I need to acknowledge those that assisted in some way. Hopefully I did not miss anyone too important, and if I did, I apologize.

This year's recipient of the Distinguished Service Award hails from a family operation that started in 1958 by his Father and Uncle with the purchase of five registered Angus heifers. The operation has grown to where today they manage 350 head of Angus cattle on over 1500 acres of land approximately 100 miles north of New York city. Their land surrounds the watershed that supplies nearly 60% of the drinking water for New York City.

In 2018 the recipient's family won the prestigious National Environmental Stewardship Award from NCBA, one of the few operations in the northeastern USA to ever win this award. This was based upon the care of the land under their management in order to insure the residents of NYC have a viable source of clean drinking water.

Our recipient is involved with the daily management of the operation along with other family members. These tasks include farming over 800 acres of hay ground, managing the 150 head cow herd, marketing purebred seedstock, embryo transfer program and a thriving freezer beef business. This is all in addition to his off the farm employment as a management consultant.

Our recipient was first elected to the NYAA Board of Directors in 2017. He was elected Vice President in 2018 and President in 2020 leading our organization through the Covid 19 lockdown. While the NYAA State Sale had to be canceled in 2020 and 2021 due to Covid restrictions, he successfully coordinated the return of the sale in 2022.

Sunday, August 27th saw the first show of the second rotation at the NY State Fair, a cooler day than we often see which was welcomed. Our judge for the day was Myron Kennedy of Brookeville, Maryland.

The showmanship competition was keenly contested in every age division. In the Senior group, Champion was Taylor Schofield, Pavilion and Reserve was Anna King, Cobleskill. Intermediates were next with Evie Groom, Lyons taking the Championship banner with Addy Tommell, Fonda in reserve and Erin Knapp, Piffard in third. In the Junior division, the largest class of the day, saw Lily Treadway, Bloomfield taking top honors with Makayla Sugg, Alden in reserve and Colton Sugg, Alden in third place. We had just one Pee Wee showman, Rosie Trowbridge, Ghent who did an excellent job to earn her banner. For the final drive, the two Seniors, top three Intermediate and top three Juniors returned to battle it out for Overall Champion. At the end of a very competitive class, Judge Kennedy selected Anna King as Champion, Evie Groom Reserve and Addy Tommell as Honorable Mention.

The breeding cattle show began with a class of Two Year Old Cow/Calf pairs. First and Champion Cow/Calf pair went to Taylor Schofield with PLR Queen Reina 9918 with a heifer calf at side. Reserve was an entry from Anna King, King Proven Queen K02J also with a heifer calf at side.

The Junior Heifer Calf division had three competitive classes of calves with Madison Oshier, Pulaski taking home the Championship banner with HMF Sweetheart 710 and reserve going to Evie Groom's Tullyfergus Erica 21L.

The Senior Heifer Calf division had only two entries but both had been shown successfully previously. On this occasion, Anna King's King Evelyn K106 took home the Champion title and Evie Groom with Tullyfergus Asia 56K in reserve.

A single Summer Yearling entry from Madison Oshier, HMF Sweet Caroline 700 garnered the divisional championship.

Four classes of Junior Yearling heifers competed for the division title. In the end, Addy Tommell saw her February '22 yearling Diekmann Sandy 2520 tapped by judge Kennedy followed by Hunter Hoppstetter, Bangor, PA with his January '22 yearling CCW Proven Queen 1252 standing reserve after coming through a very competitive class.

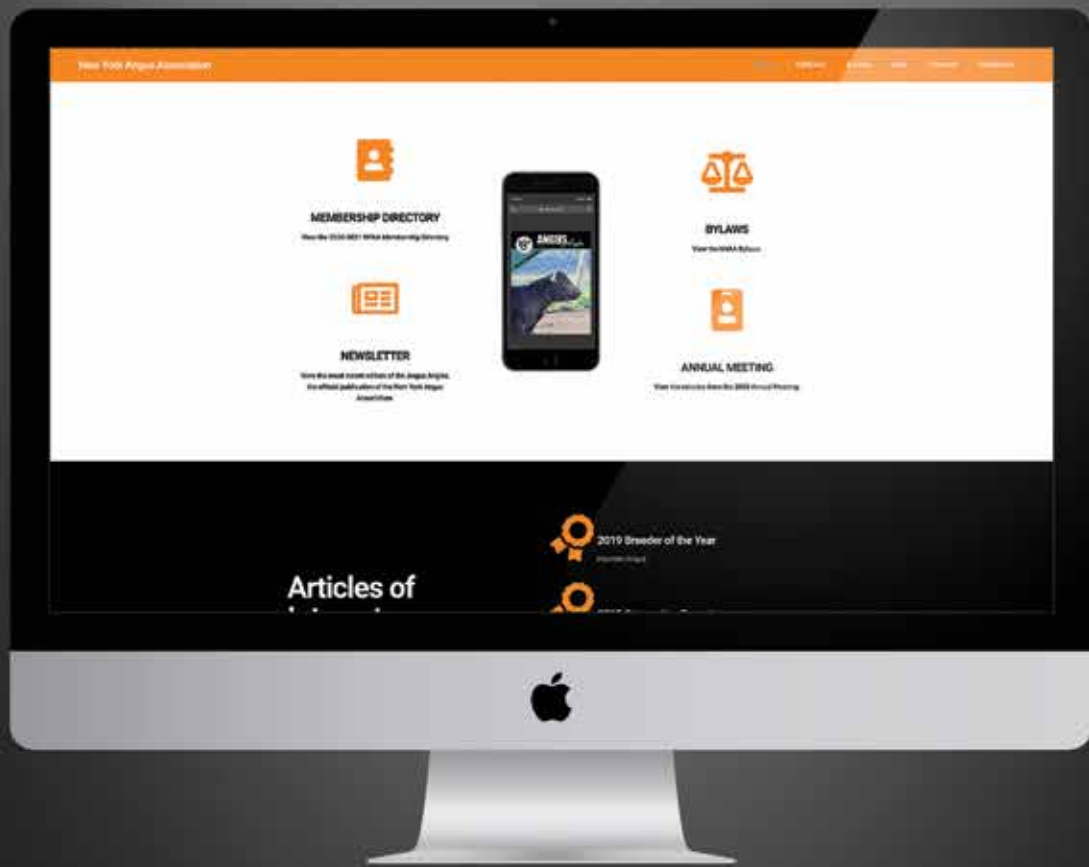
